Our Model

The **Coalfields Regeneration Trust** is a community wealth building charity with a successful track record of delivering impactful regeneration work since 1999.

Scotland's coalfields cover a large geographic area and have a combined population of approximately 554,000 people.

In order to maximise our impact, we focus our charitable activities on the 30% most deprived communities using the Index of Multiple Deprivation.



Through Scottish Government funding we deliver programmes in Scotland's Coalfields communities that address our 5 missions of community, health, skills, jobs and climate.



Our property development subsidiary **CRT Property** builds industrial units for SMEs – creating jobs and economic growth in coalfield communities.

CRT Property's taxable profits are re-invested through the **Coalfields Regeneration Trust** charity and our partners into tackling social and economic challenges in local communities.

We want to roll out our successful model of building industrial units for SMEs to create jobs and economic growth in Scotland's coalfield communities.

The needs in Carrick, Cumnock and Doon Valley

17.49% of children 19 and under are in absolute low-income families.

1 in 11 people are in bad or very bad health.

There are only 59 jobs per 100.

1 in 51 claim DLA.

1 in 4 people have no qualifications.

Of those aged 16-64, 28.71% claim DWP benefits.

CRT activities in your area

We are delivering a wide-ranging programme of community support and development across the Carrick, Cumnock and Doon Valley constituency, working closely with local partners to strengthen families, empower residents and build resilient communities. This includes supporting the community of Auchinleck to produce their LLP/AP, alongside the development of Family Hubs in Drongan, Netherthird and Dalrymple. Through Ochiltree and Dalmellington Coalfields Worx, we are helped create local opportunities and community-led solutions, while initiatives such as the Imagination Library and Connecting Communities are improving access to learning and reducing social isolation. Additionally, our Game On programme continues to inspire young people through sport and positive activity. Together, these projects reflect our commitment to investing in place, supporting families and enabling long-term community wellbeing.
